Charging and Remissions Policy

CHARGING AND REMISSIONS

In accordance with the Education Reform Act 1988, the Governing Board reserves the right to make a charge in the following circumstances for activities organised by the school:

- 1. Board and lodging on residential visits.
- 2. Costs associated with individual tuition in the playing of a musical instrument, whether in or out of school hours (unless it is provided as part of the syllabus for a prescribed public examination, or is required by the National Curriculum, or if such costs are met directly by Tameside Local Authority).
- 3. Activities which take place wholly or mainly outside school hours, but which are not provided as part of the syllabus for a prescribed public examination and are not required in order to fulfil statutory duties relating to the National Curriculum or to religious education.
- 4. The cost of entering a pupil for a public examination not prescribed in regulations, and for preparing the pupil for such an examination outside school hours.
- 5. Resits of prescribed public examinations where no further preparation has been provided by the school.
- 6. Failure to sit the final examination or to produce the required associated course work in cases where there is no good reason for such failure.
- 7. Damage to or breakages of school equipment and property which are a result of deliberate or negligent acts committed by an identified pupil or pupils.
- 8. The costs of materials, ingredients or equipment, either financially or 'in kind' for such materials as may be used in Food Technology and Resistant Materials, where parents/carers have indicated in advance their wish to own the finished product.

The Governing Board may, from time to time, amend the categories of activity for which a charge may be made. Nothing in this policy statement precludes the Governing Board from inviting parents/carers to make a voluntary contribution towards the cost of providing education for pupils.

REMISSIONS

The Governing Board has agreed that some activities and visits will be offered at no charge, or at a reduced charge, to parents/carers in particular circumstances. Remission of the fees to be charged for pupils to take part in activities will apply where parents/carers fall within the Government benefit limits in relation to income and the eligibility criteria for free school meals.
