Leadership and Voluntary Opportunities

We believe that providing pupil leadership and volunteering opportunities to be a vital part of school life. Being a part of pupil leadership and volunteering teams enables pupils to develop a personal moral code and explore values and beliefs, whilst encouraging the development of a culture that supports the characteristic of both personal and collective responsibility.

Working as part of a team provides pupils with improved communication and organisational skills as well as improved self-confidence. It helps pupils to form better relationships with peers and increases self-awareness. Working with a group of pupils who they may not ordinarily work with also helps to promote equality, diversity, and inclusion within school.

It is a DfE requirement that schools promote British Values. Having a pupil leadership teams and opportunities for voluntary work promotes Democracy, the Rule of Law, Individual Liberty and Mutual Respect and Tolerance of Different Faiths and Beliefs.

We highly value the work and contributions of our pupils, using pupil voice and action to instil purpose and meaning in all that happens at school. We strive to give opportunities for children to become confident and articulate leaders who can share and apply their skills within our community and beyond. We believe in giving pupils the opportunity to make a vital contribution to continually improving school and their learning experiences.

Pupil Groups

The Duke of Edinburgh Award

The Duke of Edinburgh Award is a way of ensuring that pupils are provided with an opportunity to undertake sustained voluntary work, learn a new skill, take part in sport beyond lessons at school and experience a challenging outdoor expedition. This is currently for pupils in Year 9 and Year 10 will begin at the end of the Autumn term in 2024, with Year 9 pupils commencing on the Bronze award, there is an opportunity for pupils that have already completed Bronze to then move on to complete their Silver Award or there is the possibility of starting with Silver Award.

Mini Dash

8 students from Year 8 (2023- 2024) had the opportunity to attend the Shrewsbury Diocese MiniDASH event, where they had the opportunity to reflect on their faith and Catholic Social Teaching as well as work as a collective with other Diocesan schools.
