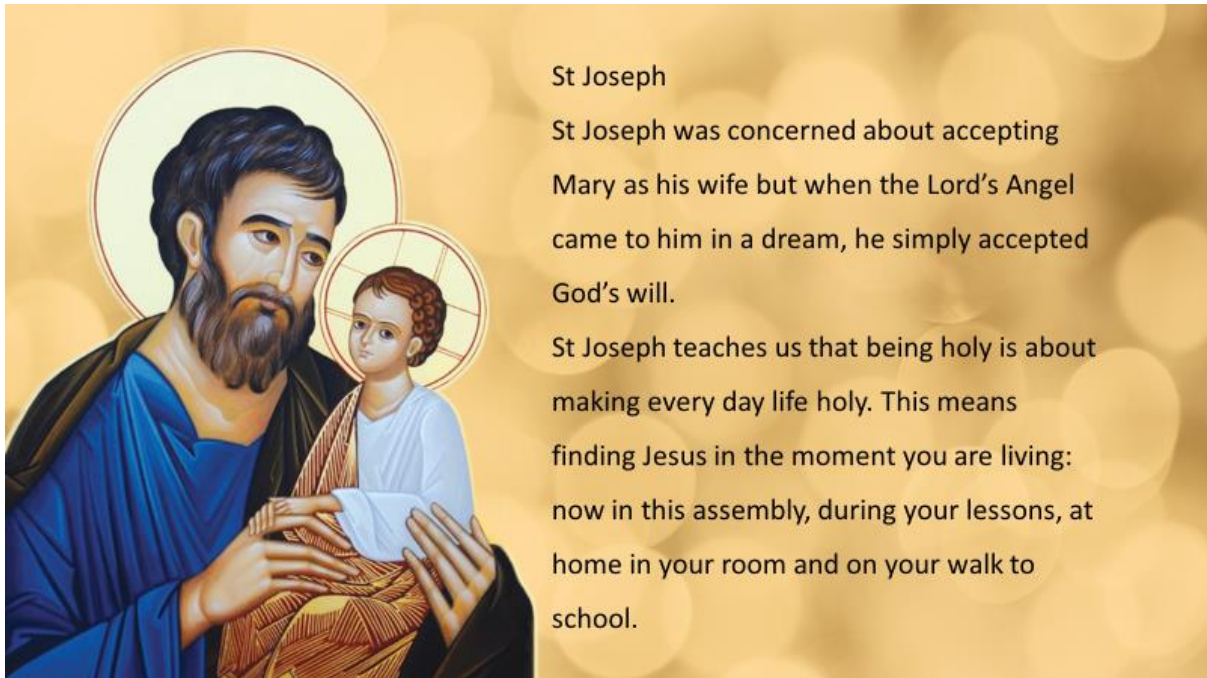


Parent bulletin 22.03.24

Canteen

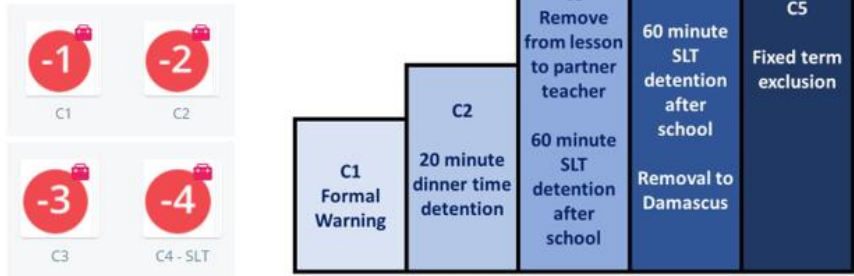
