This week collective worship has focused on giving throughout Lent. Pupils have been asked to consider how they can support CAFOD through fundraising in form groups. All pupils will have a CAFOD envelope should they want to donate individually but the focus is to come together as a community and give to those who need it most.

Class Charts

All parents and carers should now have access to Class Charts.

Class Charts allows parents to access all behaviour and reward data on their child. This is updated throughout the day as points are added to the system. *Class Charts* also has the ability to see teacher comments on incidents this means that when a behaviour point is added, parents and carers will be aware of why it has been issued and can support the teachers with conversations when a child arrives home.

Class Charts is being used as part of a staged approach to pupils' behaviour. Pupils are now awarded 10 achievement points for meeting the school values so that we can reward pupils who display our school core values. Likewise when behaviour is negative pupils that are given a formal warning are given a C1, which will appear as a formal warning through the app. If poor behaviour continues, pupils will be issued a C2 which is a lunchtime detention. The system continues to escalate in this manner.

A pupil may be issued a Head of Year Detention after school for 30 minutes for behaviour outside of the classroom, including incorrect uniform or use of a mobile phone.
