


In Loving Memory of Maisie

As a school community, we have had some very sad news this week. We shared the news with our pupils, staff and parents on Wednesday that Maisie Almond has tragically died suddenly.

On Wednesday we met with year 10 pupils to deliver an assembly to share the sad news, the school followed this by offering support to all pupils on Thursday and Friday in an extended form time and explained how, following a short illness, Maisie had sadly died. To support our pupils, we opened the Chapel in school as a quiet place for reflection and prayer and held a mass for year 10 and some of Maisie's closest friends. Over the past few days pupils have been bringing in flowers, messages and gifts to remember Maisie, our community has pulled together through this time of great sadness, thank you to all parents and carers for your wishes of support and sympathy; I would ask you all to keep Maisie's family in your thoughts and prayers.
